Clinical Pastoral Therapy training is an intensive, experiential program devoted to cultivation of knowledge and skill in the practice of care and healing of distressed persons and families. Drawing upon resources from theology and psychotherapy, participants are guided through a process of *integrative, affective learning* in relation to clinical and pastoral work that is broadly applicable to the work of ministry.

Training sessions are conducted for one-half day per week for a period of one to two years, depending upon each participant's career objectives. Sessions involve both study of relevant theory and clinical supervision of practice. Certificates of completion are awarded.

Credit toward the D.Min. degree
is available to participants through
Garrett-Evangelical Theological Seminary.

Training sessions are held one morning per week, commencing in mid-September, 2007.

PURPOSES

- To prepare ministers for professional certification as practitioners of clinical pastoral counseling by the State of North Carolina and by AAPC.
- To equip parish clergy and church professionals with a high degree of competence in pastoral counseling.

GOALS

It is intended that participants will

- Attain advanced understanding of the human personality and its relationships, theories and methods of therapeutic counseling, and application of practical theological reflection.
- Learn collaboratively from clinical and pastoral experience under qualified supervision.
- Integrate theory, practice and the use of oneself in depth ministry.

SPECIFICATIONS

Time: The training program extends across six academic trimesters (fall, winter, and spring) during the course of two years. Training sessions are held one morning per week. The next training cycle commences in mid-September, 2007.

Elements:

Theoretical seminars on assessment, counseling methods and practical theology
Group supervision
Interdisciplinary case conference
Integrative formation
Individual supervision of clinical practice

Participants will develop small counseling case loads to provide experiential material for study and reflection.

ADMISSION

Admission is by application. Applicants should meet the following qualifications:

Academic education: An M.Div. degree or equivalent from an accredited educational institution, or a Masters or Doctoral degree in a related behavioral science or health care discipline.

Clinical training: Satisfactory completion of one unit of Clinical Pastoral Education or an equivalent, or a significant period of supervised clinical experience in counseling or psychotherapy related to one's professional discipline.

Religious affiliation: Active participation as a minister or member of a religious institution or community.

FACULTY

Seminars and supervision sessions are led by Diplomates or Fellows of AAPC and doctoral level counseling practitioners. The training program is administered by **Louis B. Reed, D.Min.**, AAPC Diplomate, NC Certified Pastoral Counselor, Licensed Marriage & Family Therapist, and ACPE Supervisor (Retired). Dr. Reed has led pastoral counseling training programs for more than thirty years.
